

2023 CITY ARTS PARTNERSHIP GRANTS

The City Arts Partnership Grants invest in the overall health and success of the Metro's arts-and-culture community. The grants are funded by the Cities of Fargo, Moorhead and West Fargo. The following lists the grant award amount and the organization's mission.

FARGO THEATRE \$5,500

To preserve the historic integrity of the Theatre while expanding its ability to meet the artistic and entertainment needs of increasingly diverse audiences, performers and filmmakers.

FARGO-MOORHEAD AREA YOUTH SYMPHONIES \$3,250

To provide a rigorous orchestral experience that challenges dedicated youth to reach their full potential musically and personally and emerge as dynamic members of the community.

FARGO-MOORHEAD CHORAL ARTISTS \$3,000

To provide an outlet for musicians who are passionate about singing at a high-performance level and preserving the choral music art form.

To promote and support quality visual arts in the area by educating and encouraging visual artists and their communities.
